

BOARD OF DIRECTORS EXECUTIVE SESSIONS

The Board of Directors meets in the Executive Session on the first Wednesday of the month, immediately following the Agenda Review meeting. Minutes for the Executive Session are not available to homeowners, per NRS 116.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS NOTICE

This Notice is distributed according to NRS116.31083. The Solera at Anthem (SAA) Board meets on the second Wednesday of each month beginning at 9:30 a.m., except for two meetings per year that begin at 6 p.m. in June and October. At the beginning of every Solera at Anthem Board meeting, there is a member comment period for comments relating to agenda items only. At the end of every Board meeting, there is a member comment period for comments on any subject. During this period, the Board will hear member comments. The Board of Directors will not take action on comments or requests made during the comment period.

Agendas for the SAA Board meeting are available on Friday before the meeting at the monitor's desk. Association resident owners are entitled to receive a copy of the audio recording, the minutes or a summary of the minutes of the meeting upon request. The audio recording or minutes will be provided electronically at no charge. Printed copies of the minutes from a Board of Directors meeting are available from the Association office after the minutes have been approved by the Board of Directors; the cost is \$0.25 per page for the first ten pages and \$0.10 per page, after that.

The SAA Association office is located at 2401 Somersworth Drive, Henderson, Nevada 89044. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. The telephone number for obtaining an agenda is (702) 207-1407.

Please be advised that your Click Pay amount may not automatically update, based on your settings. ClickPay offers "Pay Full Amount," and "Pay Fixed Amount" options.

If your account is set to "Pay Fixed Amount," you will need to log in or call them directly in order to update your quarterly assessment amount to \$186.

Pay Full Amount

If your payment amount due changes each month and your management company offers the ability to view your balance, you may select the "Pay Full Amount" option, which will set your auto payment to pay each month's balance. With this option you will be given the option to enter a maximum limit. Which means you should enter the highest amount possible that you want taken out each payment. However, it is not necessary to set a maximum payment limit.

Pay Fixed Amount

If your payment amount due stays the same each month, or your management company does not offer the "Pay Full Amount" option you can choose the "Pay Fixed Amount" option, and your auto payments will pull the same amount each month from your account.

THE ANNUAL UNIT OWNERS' MEETING

The Annual Unit Owners' Meeting is on February 20 in the Stardust Ballroom. At this meeting, you will be able to get the results of the 2019 Board of Directors election. At 4 p.m. ballots must be in possession of the Election Process Supervisor to be counted. The Annual Unit Owners Meeting is called to order, then recessed during counting. At 6 p.m. the Annual Unit Owners Meeting re-convenes immediately following the Annual Meeting.

Note to candidates: February 21 is the deadline for candidates to remove all posters and signs from the community.

We are repairing & repainting the wrought iron fencing of your community!

What areas are being repaired & repainted?

We are repairing & repainting the **wrought iron fencing** of your community. This will include but not limited to the common area fencing as well as the fencing at the backs of your homes (if the back of your home backs up to common area only). Party fences (fencing between neighbors) are not included in the scope of work.

When will you begin repairing & repainting?

The project will begin Friday February 1st, weather permitting. We will be onsite Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:30am and 3:30pm. You will receive a door hanger notice 24-48hrs before we are to work in your area.

How long will the project take?

Painting will take approximately 8 weeks.

What if it is windy and/or rainy?

The crews will not be onsite if we are experiencing poor weather (high winds and/or rain) but will return the following morning, weather permitting.

Do I need to do anything?

Please remove all items of value and/or decorative items from the fencing at the rear of your home once you receive your door hanger notice. We will need clear access to be able to repair & repaint.

We will need any foliage and/or landscaping to be cut back a minimum 6"-12" clear from the fencing. Note from Management: Please be advised that if you do not have foliage trimmed away from the fence by February 1st, we will have the foliage trimmed and bill the services back to you.

Overall, simply be aware of EmpireWorks employees, equipment, and wet paint! All employees will be wearing EmpireWorks shirts and areas where we are working will be clearly marked with cones, caution tape, and wet paint signs.



The following items and structures are not permitted on lots in Solera at Anthem: storage buildings, clotheslines, detached garages, tents, compost piles, decks or balconies, dog runs, basketball goals, weather vanes, casitas, exterior window planters, and transmitting/receiving antennae.

Instructions for completing the Official Ballot

Homeowners will receive their official ballot in the mail during the last week of January, 2019. Homeowners are encouraged to attend the "Meet the Candidates" night on Thursday, January 24, 2019, at 6:00 PM in the Stardust Room of the Clubhouse prior to casting their vote. Before you mail your ballot or place it in the ballot box, please be sure to follow these instructions, otherwise your vote may not be counted.

The Ballot:

- o You must be a member in good standing in order for your vote to be counted.
- o Each homeowner can vote for only four (4) candidates.
- o Only one vote per candidate.
- o Do not make any comments, remarks or any other markings on the ballot other than your vote(s).
- o Insert the completed ballot into the small green envelope.

The Small Green Envelope:

- o Insert the completed ballot into the small green envelope.
- o Do not make any comments, remarks or any other markings on the small green envelope marked "BALLOT"
- o Do **not** include your name, address or any other identifying information on the small green envelope.
- o Seal the small green envelope.
